“Unsinkable Atheism,” the 14th Annual Atheist Alliance International (AAI) Convention, will be held the weekend of September 25—28, 2008 on the beautiful and historic *Queen Mary*, which is permanently docked in Long Beach, California.

Thursday, September 25, 2008

The AAI Board of Directors will conduct a pre-convention business session from 1:00 PM—6:00 PM. AAI Board meetings are open to the public. 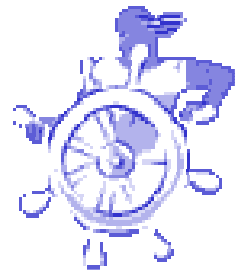
Complimentary apple pie and ice cream will be served at the end of this session to celebrate the fact that “Atheism is as American as apple pie.”

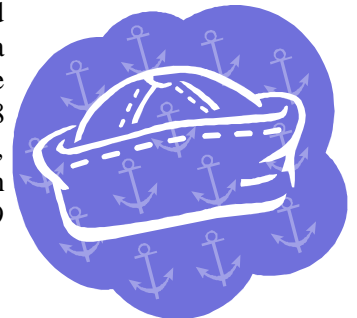
Annie Laurie Gaylor ~ Freedom From Religion Foundation President
